- ❖ In cooperation with other organizations and institutions, speak as a unified group to promote the preservation of Great Lakes maritime history.

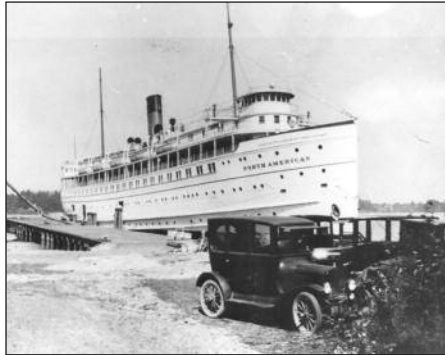


THE ASSOCIATION FOR GREAT LAKES MARITIME HISTORY IS . . .

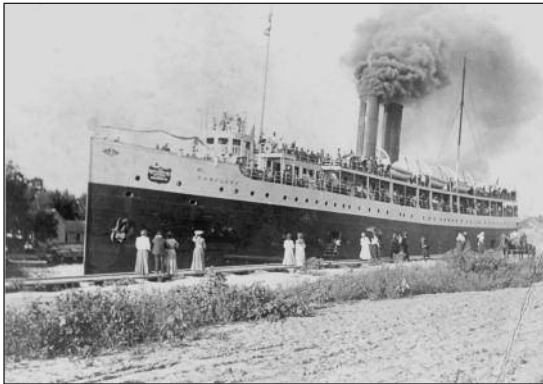
