2021 Conference Speakers



Erie's Maritime Heritage Hosts

Staff from the Flagship Niagara League and the Erie Maritime Museum will explore their related institutional histories and discuss facets of their historic vessel and sail-training missions.



Jim Kennard – "Shipwrecks of Lake Ontario"

Jim Kennard has discovered more than 200 shipwrecks including the two oldest shipwrecks discovered in the Great Lakes. Jim and his shipwreck teams have appeared in numerous print and video publications. He received the 2015 AGLMH Joyce S. Hayward Award for Historic Interpretation for the shipwreck documentation on his website www.shipwreckworld.com. This presentation will expound on the material compiled in his 2019 book, "Shipwrecks of Lake Ontario: A Journey of Discovery."



Walter Lewis – "Great Lakes Ship Repair Facilities"

Walter Lewis is the primary developer at OurDigitalWorld, an Ontario-based not-for-profit that hosts online cultural content, including Lewis's award-winning "Maritime History of the Great Lakes." His presentation asks, "Could a shipyard survive long without an associated repair facility?" Over the nineteenth century the continued "health" of a growing Great Lakes fleet gradually became dependent on specialized ship repair facilities that included marine railways, dry docks and floating docks.



Ric Mixter - "Bottled Goodbyes"

This "Lower Lakes" version of his recent publication of the same name will bring Ric's signature humanization to stories of Great Lakes love and loss. Over the last 30 years, Mixter, a professional videographer, has been combining his reporting skills with his passion for wreck diving. Besides his numerous book and video releases, Ric is an animated presenter of live Great Lakes history, including his multi-media show, "Fury."



Timothy Runyan- "Show Me the Money"

Tim Runyan is Professor Emeritus of Maritime Studies and Faculty Fellow in the Honors College at East Carolina University. He is chairman of the National Maritime Alliance and chairs the editorial board of *Sea History* magazine. He is a past president of the Great Lakes Historical Society and a founder and trustee of Cleveland's Great Lakes Science Center. His keynote address will explore a topic dear to his heart – sustainable funding for maritime heritage research, exploration, preservation, and education.
